


So what is OK to pour down your sink drain?

Hi, I'm Inspector Bret! Everything poured into our sink drains and flushed down our toilets ends up in our oceans, so if it's not good for us to drink or eat, it won't be good for frogs, insects, birds and fish either. If there is any doubt about environmentally responsible disposal, you should contact the City of Memphis Environmental Dept at 901-636-8118. If any product says "hazardous waste" on the label, it must be taken to a disposal facility! All other products in question should go into the regular garbage, (things like medicine, cleaning products and paint) don't flush it down the toilet or wash it down the drain. Why? Because modern landfills are designed with liners to prevent dangerous material from leeching out, whereas waste water treatment systems might not even detect—let alone eliminate—substances in water that can harm wildlife.




Begin by cutting strips of paper measuring 1.5" by 8".

7 Tips for Raising Caring Kids

Harvard Graduate School of Education

Research in human development clearly shows that the seeds of empathy, caring, and compassion are present from early in life, but that to become caring, ethical people, children need adults to help them at every stage of childhood to nurture these seeds into full development.

Below are a set of guideposts to raising caring, respectful, and ethical children:

1. Work to develop caring, loving relationships with your kids.

Loving our children takes many forms, such as tending to their physical and emotional needs, providing a stable and secure family environment, showing affection, respecting their individual personalities, taking a genuine interest in their lives, talking about things that matter, and affirming their efforts and achievements.

2. Be a strong moral role model and mentor.

Pay close attention to whether you are practicing honesty, fairness, and caring yourself and modeling skills like solving conflicts peacefully and managing anger and other difficult emotions effectively.

3. Make caring for others a priority and set high ethical expectations.

A big part of prioritizing caring is holding children to high ethical expectations, such as honoring their commitments.

4. Provide opportunities for children to practice caring and gratitude.

Learning to be grateful and caring is in certain respects like learning to play a sport or an instrument.

5. Expand your child's circle of concern.

It is important that children learn to zoom in, listening closely and attending to those in their immediate circle, and to zoom out, taking in the big picture and considering the range of people they interact with every day.

6. Promote children's ability to be ethical thinkers and positive change-makers in their communities.

You can help children become ethical thinkers and leaders by listening to and helping them think through their own ethical dilemmas.

7. Help children develop self-control and manage feelings effectively.

We can teach children that all feelings are ok, but some ways of dealing with them are not useful. Children need our help learning to cope with feelings in productive ways.





FEBRUARY TOPIC: HAND WASHING FOR LITTLE ONES

How do you get your young children into the hand washing habit?

It is important to help your children form good hygiene habits early in life. Let them know proper hand washing helps keep them from being sick or causing others to be sick.

A few situations when a child should always wash his/her hands include:

- Before eating
- After using the bathroom
- After playing with pets
- After contact with a sick person
- After handling bandages or soiled diapers

What's best to use for a germ-killing "antibacterial" soap?

Recently, the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) concluded that many so-called antibacterial soaps on the market killed good as well as bad bacteria when used on the skin. Therefore, the FDA removed 19 antibacterial ingredients from hand wash products which were deemed to be unproven or not safe in germ control.

Currently, the approved antibacterial products for hand washing contain ingredients such as benzalkonium chloride, benzethonium chloride and chloroxylenol. These same ingredients remain under study. Avoid purchasing any products claiming to prevent infections from flu, Salmonella, E.coli, MRSA and other bacterial or viral organisms according to the FDA. Good old soap and water remain the best prevention.

What is the proper method for cleaning hands with ordinary soap and water?

- Wet hands under warm or cold water. Turn off the tap and apply soap to hands
- Rub hands together vigorously for about 20 seconds
- Sing a little song in your head like "Eensy Weensy Spider" or "Happy Birthday" twice
- Encourage children to scrub between fingers and backs of their hands. Don't forget grime under the nails which may require a stiff nail brush.
- Rinse hands with clean running water and dry with a clean towel or paper towel.

What about hand sanitizers or antiseptic wipes?

- When soap and water are not available, choose a hand sanitizer or wipe containing at least 60% alcohol.
- Remember to prevent small children from swallowing such products or getting it in their eyes.
- Rub a quarter-size blob of the sanitizer on the front and backs of hands as well as between the fingers until hands are dry. Do not rinse. [If a child swallows hand sanitizer, call the Poison Hotline at 800.222.1222]

Tips for success:

- Lead by example. Wash your own hands before meals or cooking a meal, after using the bathroom, after playing with pets or after handling contaminated objects like soiled diapers or garbage.
- Remind the child often. Good habits take time to form.
- Exercise patience and always praise good behavior or success.







Hi, I'm Inspector Bret! Everything poured into our sink drains and flushed down our toilets ends up in our oceans, so if it's not good for us to drink or eat, it won't be good for frogs, insects, birds and fish either. If there is any doubt about environmentally responsible disposal, you should contact the City of Memphis Environmental Dept at 901-636-8118. If any product says "hazardous waste" on the label, it must be taken to a disposal facility! All other products in question should go into the regular garbage, (things like medicine, cleaning products and paint) don't flush it down the toilet or wash it down the drain. Why? Because modern landfills are designed with liners to prevent dangerous material from leeching out, whereas waste water treatment systems might not even detect—let alone eliminate—substances in water that can harm wildlife.
