City parks play a vital role in the social, economic, and physical well-being of america's cities and their residents.

As cities become more densely populated and concern about the impact of climate change increases, planners, elected officials, and community advocates are taking a fresh look at parks and their potential to help address critical urban infrastructure and public health issues. Parks are now recognized as powerful tools for urban communities and local economies. City Parks provide access to recreational opportunities, increase property values, spur local economies, combat crime, and protect cities from environmental impact.

Memphis is home to 150+ parks, 30 community and senior centers, 17 pools, 7 golf courses, 3 splash pads, 81 playgrounds, 78 pavilions, 4 dog parks and 80 tennis courts. Memphis Parks manages over 150 sites which comprise over 5,600 acres of land. These are your parks, facilities, trails, and playgrounds. Along with a vast amount of programs and recreational services, they "strive to create positive and safe places to provide you opportunities to find common ground with your fellow Memphians, celebrate life, and strengthen mind and body". Currently, over 40 million dollars is being invested into improvements in local parks like Audubon Park, Douglass Park, Gaston Community Center, Pine Hill Golf Course, Chelsea Greenline and more. 

No matter what the weather brings, playing outside is good for kids. There is scientific evidence that playing outside improves health, and children of all ages love it.

Playing outside & exploring nature is for all ages

Bringing baby outside.

The earlier you share nature with your baby, the more likely they are to develop a life-long love of the outdoors. Even infants and toddlers can play and learn in nature. Take a walk through the trees using a carrier or stroller. Throw down a blanket on the grass or soft earth. Let your baby enjoy the fresh breezes, bird songs, forest smells and plant textures. Give them some outside tummy time, blowing bubbles for them to reach for and watch glisten in the sun.

Explore with preschoolers and younger children.

Young children are developing and learning from every experience.

- Build nature sculptures.
- Bike or walk with the family.
- Take story time outside.
- Outdoor playdates at parks or at home.

Challenge older children & teens.

Stay engaged with the outdoors as a family. Take advantage of this time to bond over games and activities you all enjoy or challenge yourselves with something new.

Healthy benefits of outdoor play


Getting outside provides more than a fun break for children and teenagers. It is also good for their physical and mental health and development. Children and teens who spend time playing outside and enjoying nature can be:




Build a Rain Gauge

Here are the materials you will need:

- Scissors
- Empty/Clean 2 Liter Bottle
- Permanent Marker
- Rocks
- Water
- Measuring Tape









- **3.** From the mark of the top of rocks take the tape measure at 0 and have an adult use the permanent marker and mark every inch. Then write 1", 2" etc.
- **4.** Take the top of the 2 liter that you set aside, turn upside down and place inside your rain guage. Pour water over the rocks up to the bottom mark.



5. Set your rain gauge in a garden and wait for rain!
You'll need to pick a really good spot! You want somewhere level that's open to the sky and that's not likely to get too windy, where the gauge won't be disturbed. There shouldn't be anything hanging over the gauge that could either block any rain or make extra raindrops drip into the bottle (like a tree or a power line or the edge of a roof).



That's how you build a rain gauge!!! So simple and fun.
