



Fun Gardening Activities To Do With Kids

There are several activities you can have your child do to make gardening interesting. If you want to plan a fun project or activity with your kids, it may get them more invested in the garden. Kids love the chance to put their own spin on a garden. Here are some of the best gardening activities to do with kids.

Grow Flowers With Their Name

If your child has a floral or nature name, invite them to plant the corresponding plant in their garden plot! Many of these plants are easy to grow (or just transplant, if you'd like to keep things super simple), including sage, African violets, daisies, ivy, and basil. If your child doesn't have a botanical name, you can use the name of a family member, friend, or neighbor.

Grow All The Colors Of The Rainbow

It can be fun to grow gardens in segments, letting kids work on one section at a time. One fun activity is to plant a rainbow garden. Choose your favorite herbs, flowers, fruits, or vegetables in each color.

Here are some suggestions for each color of your rainbow garden: Red – bell peppers, roses, strawberries, cherry tomatoes, radishes Orange – marigolds, orange peppers, pumpkins, nasturtiums, carrots Yellow – squash, sunflowers, daisies, gourds Green – zucchini, herbs, lettuce, onions Blue – cornflowers, hydrangeas Purple – purple cabbage, pansies, eggplant Pink – hydrangeas, mosaic plants, some succulents White – baby's breath, lilies, cauliflower, mushrooms

Choose Plants That You Can Snack On

If there is anything more fun than seeing your garden grow, it is getting to eat the food you grew yourself. Kids love eating food out of the garden. Plant various fruits, veggies, and herbs that kids can pick and enjoy whenever you are out in the yard. Some favorites include tomatoes, strawberries, carrots, greens, and even edible flowers.



Plan Ahead

Make a calendar together of anticipated growth and harvest dates and develop ideas for using your plants. None of these dates will be exact, but a calendar is the perfect way to provide a visual guide for your kids and give them an idea of when they can anticipate seeing the fruits of their labor.

Make a Pizza Garden

If your kids love pizza, try growing a "pizza garden" together. For this, you'll need a circular garden plot and several sticks so that you can divide the plot into "slices". In each slice, grow one of the ingredients you need to make homemade pizza, such as onions, tomatoes, basil, bell peppers, and mushrooms. You can plan a pizza night or pizza party with your favorite toppings when the garden is ready.

Decorate Your Garden With Rocks

This is a simple but fun activity that kids will love. All you have to do is find several large, mostly smooth rocks and let your kids go crazy painting them. You can use these as garden markers or simply let them use them to customize their garden plot. Just make sure that you use oil-based paint to prevent it from fading away the next time it rains!

It teaches important life lessons like patience and responsibility and even has physical health benefits, including immune system strengthening and reduced allergy rates. 

MAY TOPIC: What to Know About Hay Fever in Kids

What is hay fever in kids?

Hay fever, sometimes called seasonal allergies or seasonal allergic rhinitis, is an inflammation of the membranes that line the sinuses. When this part of the body becomes inflamed due to an allergic reaction, it produces classic cold-like symptoms in children and adults.

What are the symptoms of hay fever in kids?

In general, children's hay fever symptoms follow the typical pattern seen in adults. If your child's immune system is reacting to something in the air, they may experience symptoms such as:

sneezing | runny nose | sinus congestion | itchy, watery eyes | coughing

What causes hay fever in kids?

The term "hay fever" is a bit of a misnomer. This condition doesn't occur from hay and doesn't give your child a fever. Instead, hay fever occurs when blooming plants like trees, flowers, grasses, and weeds release pollen into the air. If your child is allergic to this pollen, their immune system responds by releasing histamine into their bloodstream. When their body releases histamine, it creates inflammation that results in unpleasant respiratory symptoms.

How is hay fever in kids diagnosed?

You may be able to identify hay fever in your child on your own.

If their symptoms are seasonal, waxing and waning with changes in the weather, this is a strong indicator. According to the American College of Allergy, Asthma, and Immunology, in the United States, spring allergies — the ones that are often most bothersome — begin in February and last until early summer. Consider whether this is the time your child experiences their symptoms.

Similarly, a child's symptoms that seem to come and go depending on their location, such as when they're in the presence of a family pet or in a dusty environment, can be another sign that they're related to hay fever. If you bring your child to their pediatrician for a diagnosis, their doctor may perform tests to rule out other causes of their symptoms, such as asthma.

They may also refer you to an allergist who can perform skin prick tests for an accurate picture of what your child is allergic to. These tests can often determine, for example, whether your child is allergic to grass, specific types of pollen, or flowers.

What is the treatment for hay fever in kids?


Most treatments for hay fever in kids are simple to do at home. Many over-the-counter antihistamine medications for seasonal allergies include products and dosages for children. Always be sure to follow appropriate dosing and clear any concerns with your child's doctor before starting a new medication.

Nasal sprays, cold compresses on the face, and neti pots can also be useful tools for clearing nasal congestion in kids.

There are also plenty of options for reducing allergens in your home. The American Academy of Pediatrics suggests: - washing linens weekly

- replacing pillows every 2 to 3 years
- keeping your child away from piles of dead leaves
- using allergen-proof zip-up covers on mattresses and cushions

SCIENCEFUN

Grow a Grass Caterpillar!

Here are the materials you will need:

- scissors
- 2 paper or plastic cup
- soil & quick grow grass seeds
- nylon stockings
- hair bands or rubber bands
- pipe cleaners & any decorating items
- plastic tray / bucket
- garbage bag



1. In a plastic bucket or tub mix together seed-raising mix and grass seeds. Enough to fill one or a couple of stocking legs.

2. Cut the waist band off the stockings, so you have just two leg section like tubes.

3.Cut the bottom off one of the cups to make it into a funnel. Insert and hold it into the top of one of the stocking legs to help you fill the leg with soil easily.







4. Fill the stocking leg with soil, quite full, remove the funnel and knot off the end.

5. Using the coloured hair ties, divide the stocking into sections – to make the caterpillar's body.

6. Soak your caterpillar in a bucket or tub of water for 10 minutes. Remove and place on a large tray. Cover the caterpillar and the tray in the garbage bag overnight.

7. Remove the stocking from the garbage bag and place in a sunny outdoor position. Water it daily and within 7-10 days your cute little caterpillar will start to sprout hair.

8. Once grass starts sprouting you can add your eyes, legs and antennae.

9. Trim your grass with scissors to give your caterpillar a cool hair cut!

10. Water regularly so it doesn't dry out and wilt.








WHAT IS TRANSPIRATION?

Transpiration is the evaporation of water from plants, especially leaves. It is a type of translocation and part of the water cycle. The amount of water lost by a plant depends on its size, the light intensity, temperature, humidity, wind speed, and soil water supply. The process of Transpiration helps in regulating temperature in the plant. Transpiration also pulls water through the plant. This brings with it the mineral nutrients from roots to shoots. Water moves out of the leaves into the atmosphere.
